Evidence of the crime of an election law violation, including but not limited to a component of voting/election equipment. Specifically, the scan unit for a "Hart Intercivic tabulator. The affiant has viewed photos of this device and it is similar in appearance to a touch screen tablet.

- 3) **The facts establishing probable cause or the grounds for search are:**

Your Affiant is a D/Sergeant with the Michigan State Police Jackson Post and has been employed in law enforcement for over 10 years. Affiant has served in multiple capacities during his career with the Michigan State Police to include: Patrol Trooper at the Lansing Post, and 1st District Detective Trooper.

Your Affiant is currently investigating the accusation of an election law violation. During the afternoon of Wednesday October 27<sup>th</sup> Affiant was contacted by Darryl Hill of the Secretary of State (Michigan). Hill advised that the Michigan Secretary of State (SOS) has directed Stephanie Scott to return a tabulator to SOS or their representative. Scott has so far failed to return the equipment as of 10/27/2021.

Information gained from SOS indicates Stephanie Scott is currently the Adams<sup>o</sup> Township Clerk in Hillsdale County, in the state of Michigan. Also that Stephanie Scott's phone number is 612-718-3700.

According to MCL 168.931 section h, "(1) A person who violates 1 or more of the following subdivisions is guilty of a misdemeanor:" and "(h) A person shall not willfully fail to perform a duty imposed upon that person by this act, or disobey a lawful instruction or order of the secretary of state as chief state election officer or of a board of

county election commissioners, board of city election commissioners, or board of inspectors of election.”

On 10/29/2021 Tpr. Bacon and Affiant spoke with Adams Township Supervisor Mark Nichols in the parking lot of Adams Township hall (the place to be searched). Nichols declined to answer any questions about his potential knowledge of the scan unit’s location. Nichols also advised that investigators would not be allowed inside the office spaces of the building’s interior.

On 10/29/2021 Affiant spoke with a female subject on the phone who identified themselves as Stephanie. Stephanie acknowledged she was an official with the township. This information indicates that Affiant was speaking to Stephanie Scott, the Adams Township Clerk. Stephanie Scott acknowledged that she had knowledge of the current location of the scan unit. Stephanie’s phone number is 612-718-3700. Stephanie advised that once Affiant obtains a search warrant, she would tell Affiant where to look inside the township hall.

The Affiant has not included every fact of this investigation known to the Michigan State Police. Rather, Affiant has included facts that are material to the probable cause relevant to the search and seizure of the items requested in this affidavit and search warrant.

Your Affiant believes that based upon the above listed information, the issuance of this search warrant may result in the recovery of evidence of an election law violation.

Property item number 1 for Michigan State Police complaint 13-6286-21. This item is a scan unit for a Hart Intercivic voting tabulator with the following description: similar in appearance to a touch screen tablet, serial number S1701350410, white with black trim, and 5 unbroken tamper seals on the device.

This scan unit was originally located at the Adams Township Hall, 5675 Knowles Rd, North Adams, MI 49262, in the township clerk's office. After seizure by way of search warrant. This device is currently located at 3401 Cooper St. Jackson, MI 49201 (MSP Jackson Post), inside the secure evidence/property storage room.

- 2) **And that the items to be searched, seized, secured, tabulated according to law are the following property and things:**

Evidence of the crime of a voting law violation and/or misconduct in office, including, but not limited to: Any and all data stored on the above-mentioned device or any secondary storage devices contained within. During the afternoon of Wednesday October 27th Affiant was contacted by Darryl Hill of the Office of Investigative Services (State of Michigan). Hill advised that the Michigan Secretary of State (SOS) has directed Stephanie Scott to return voting equipment to SOS or their representative. Scott had so far failed to return the equipment as of 10/27/2021.
- c. Information gained from SOS indicates Stephanie Scott is currently the Adams Township Clerk in Hillsdale County, in the state of Michigan. Also, that Stephanie Scott's phone number is 612-718-3700.

- g. In the afternoon of 10/29/2021, Affiant obtained a judge's signature on a search warrant for the Adam's Township hall. Upon executing the search warrant, the scan unit for the voting tabulator being searched for was located in a locked file cabinet in the office of the township clerk. The device found and seized can be described with the following: similar in appearance to a touch screen tablet, serial number S1701350410, white with black trim, and 5 unbroken tamper seals on the device.
- h. After viewing a photo of the seized device, a representative of the SOS Bureau of Elections confirmed it was the same device they had been seeking to perform maintenance and accuracy testing on.
- i. Affiant has been given records of email correspondence between Stephanie Scott and various State of Michigan and Hillsdale County Officials. Scott had been given direction via email to submit the voting equipment in her possession for maintenance and accuracy testing many times. On the following dates, Scott was given or reminded of the above mentioned direction/orders and would eventually go on to acknowledge each one of them via email:
  - a. 7/27/21, direction by Abe Dane (Hillsdale County Chief Deputy Clerk), acknowledged by Scott
  - b. 7/30/21, direction by Abe Dane (Hillsdale County Chief Deputy Clerk), acknowledged by Scott
  - c. 10/16/21, direction by Jonathan Brater (SOS Director of Elections), acknowledged by Scott
  - d. 10/19/21, direction by Jonathan Brater (SOS Director of Elections), acknowledged by Scott
  - e. 10/26/21, direction by Abe Dane (Hillsdale County Chief Deputy Clerk), acknowledged by Scott.
- j. In reading the above mentioned email correspondence, Affiant has learned the following. Scott led Jonathan Brater (SOS Director of Elections) to believe that she had coordinated with Hillsdale County Deputy Clerk, Abe Dane and she would be submitting her election equipment for testing on 10/27/2021. Scott did not submit the equipment for testing on 10/27/21.

- k. Among the information given to the affiant by SOS is a link to a YouTube video titled "Adams Township Meeting 10-11-2021". Upon viewing this video, Affiant has observed the following. A female subject who introduced herself as Stephanie Scott, the Adams Township Clerk, can be seen and heard addressing the board and those in attendance.
  - a. Scott expresses her intentions to ignore the direction given to her by Hillsdale County and State of Michigan Officials to present the voting equipment for maintenance and testing.
  - b. Scott expressed concerns that allowing the voting equipment to be handled by someone else allows for the possibility that information may be deleted from the device.
  - c. Scott states that the tabulator likely has information on it. She also verbalized the possibility that when the testing was performed on the machine before the special election in March of 2021, it may have deleted information from the November 2020 election.
  - d. Scott states that she had been told that the device contains a modem allowing for the possibility for the device to connect to the internet and other cellular communication hardware allowing it to connect to cell phone towers.
  - e. Scott acknowledged that Adams Township has received legal advice from their counsel, that they cannot conduct an election via paper ballots because the state of Michigan has implemented a uniform voting system.
- l. Scott defends her actions and/or failure to follow lawful orders/directives from SOS by citing her belief that the voting equipment in question potentially contains evidence of an unsecure election process and or voter fraud. Because of this, Affiant believes that viewing the digital contents/data on the device to be searched will either show that her claim has no merit or support her justification of her actions. Either way, the search of this device will further this investigation.
- m. The Affiant has not included every fact of this investigation known to the Michigan State Police. Rather, Affiant has included facts that are material to the probable cause relevant to the search and seizure of the items requested in this affidavit and search warrant.
- n. Your Affiant believes that based upon the above listed information, the issuance of this search warrant may result in the recovery of evidence of an election law violation, misconduct in office, or willful neglect of duty in public office.

- n. On 11/15/2021 I obtained a search warrant, signed by a judge, to have a data extraction performed on the above listed scan unit/tablet.
- o. On 11/29/2021, Affiant learned from the MSP Computer Crimes Unit (CCU) that a data extraction was done on the above mentioned scan unit/tablet. Unfortunately, all of the data extracted is encrypted and cannot be interpreted or understood at this time. CCU believes that having the use of the additional voting equipment and information sought in this search warrant would assist in un-encrypting the data.
- p. In November, 2021, Affiant spoke with Peter Lichtenheld on the phone multiple times. Lichtenheld is the Vice President for customer success for Hart Intercivic, the manufacturer of the voting equipment in question. He advised the Affiant of the following. The data on the scan unit/tablet can only be un-encrypted and viewed in a readable format when viewed using the following items in conjunction with the scan unit/tablet already seized.
  - a. The specific terminal/base station assigned to the scan unit/tablet
  - b. The V-drive used on that scan unit in the last election (USB device)
