

To the Chair and Members of the Hillsdale County Board of Commissioners,

Late last evening, several members of Hillsdale Conservatives became aware, through direct communication with individual commissioners and through a public statement made by a commissioner at a township meeting, that the Formal Notice and Proposed Resolution submitted by Hillsdale Conservatives will not be placed on the agenda for the Board's January 13 meeting.

I respectfully note that the submitted materials do not request intervention in, or comment on, any matter currently pending before the Circuit Court. The request relies on sworn testimony already given under oath and on a District Court ruling that dismissed the search warrant at issue as unlawful. Those events are completed judicial actions and are part of the permanent court record.

The submitted materials request acknowledgment of those established facts, preservation of county records, and referral actions that fall within the Board's governing and fiduciary authority. They do not seek adjudication, prosecution, or direction of any ongoing judicial proceeding.

I will attend the January 13 meeting and address this matter during public comment in order to ensure that the Board's refusal to place the item on the agenda, and the reasons stated for that refusal, are accurately reflected in the public record and the minutes of the meeting.

This email is sent solely to confirm notice, clarify the procedural posture of the request, and preserve the record.
